





Strengthening Partners in Service YMCA's and Y's Men's Clubs

Soon after being appointed as ASD YL YMCA Liaison, I found that everyone knew that the Y's Men movement is to support YMCA movement in the area. But in reality, it is not happening in many parts of the world.

I went to Denmark this summer to attend the 20th World Council. One of the key issues they focused was the Vision 2030. After Covid-19, we have experienced many unprecedented rapid changes.

I would like to introduce one project that we, both YMCA and Y's Men East and West Japan Regions started in 2022.

The youth were challenged to propose a project to deal with any issue related to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In order to encourage young people, youth groups, schools and

YMCA youth volunteers, YMCA and YM Japan East and Japan West decided to fund 10 small projects proposed in the so called SDGs Youth Action.

The SDG's were adopted at the United Nations Summit in September 2015, and are the goals that 193 United Nations member countries will achieve over the 15-year period from 2016 to 2030

We opened applications for this project from December 2021 to February 2022, and 18 project proposals were received from the whole Japan.

We listened to all the project plans through a Zoom gathering in March, and selected 10 top projects. These projects were then supported with funds (maximum of USD1500 per project) according to their proposals.

Projects started moving from April

2022 and will end in January 2023. All the 10 projects selected are still active. We will have a mid-year presentation in September 2022 and the final presentation in February 2023.

This is the first year of joint partnership work in Japan for both YMCA and Y's Men. We will try to procure additional funds next year to support more projects if our evaluation of these initial projects are with positive outcome and above par.

During the Centennial celebration






the Songbook will be presented as an e-book or hard copy. Some songs will be introduced.

International Dues

The amount per member for 1st semester 2022/23 is Swiss Francs (CHF) 17.50. The deadline for paying the 1st semester international dues is 31 August 2022. These are based on the 1 August 2022 membership reports and cover the period 1 July – 31 December 2022. An invoice will be sent to you upon receipt of your report.

50% discount for spouses and younger members (18-35) to join as new members of the club. This promotion has been extended by one year.

Spouse discount

Spouses of existing club members who have joined a club any time as a new member after July 01, 2019 are eligible for a 50% discount on international dues during 2022/23. This is applicable only for new club members. Spouses who are already joined as club members are not eligible for the discount. This

offer is open to both new and existing clubs where the new member is the partner of an existing member.

Young member discount (18-35)

Persons aged between 18 and 35 who join a YMI club as a new member any time after July 01, 2020, either existing or newly chartered, are eligible for a 50% discount on international dues. Eliaibility must be verified through submission of a copy of the new club members' passport or another official document of identity to IHQ as proof of age. This is applicable only for new club members members in this age bracket who have already joined as club members are not eligible for the discount.

Regions must report new spouse & young members to IHQ using the form provided no later than the cut-off dates for semester reporting (new club members can also be invited to complete the form themselves):
