# Through the years ...

The history of the Philippine Y'sdom dates back to 1927 when China expanded their South China district by organizing a club in Cebu, Philippines. The club functioned 1933 until 1939, interrupted by World War II.



Philippine Y'sdom re-emerged when the YMC Manila was organized on April 04, 1941. The club inauguration scheduled for Christmas of 1941 was disrupted on  $8^{th}$  December due to the  $2^{nd}$  World War.





The club reorganized in 1945, its Charter granted on August 03, 1946. The Philippines was granted a Region status at the 1947 Toledo Convention as five Clubs had been organized and duly chartered; a condition set by the International Board. A tangible show of devotion to the movement, a **Plaque** entitled "**Birthplace of Y'sdom Plaque**" was placed in the lobby of the Toledo Central YMCA in 1959.

The Philippine Y's dom glorious years were seen in the early 40's to the late 70's; consistently receiving International awards, with dynamic YMCA partnership and members gaining International leadership posts.

# **Region in Focus**

The 1972 Martial Law declaration notably caused the Region's decline. Additionally, natural calamities, traffic chaos and other factors resulted to inactive clubs. Some clubs however, continued to serve their communities.

Dedicated leadership surmounted all sorts of above-mentioned challenges. But when the leadership became the problem, in 2021 concerned members having no other alternative, sought for the Area's intervention. After so many failed opportunities of requested dialogue, the ASP Troika in its ardent desire to save the region, appointed the Philippine Regional Interim Committee (PRIAC) comprised of steadfast regional leaders: PICM Larry Chan (Chairman), PICM "Inday" Morales and PRD Paul Lim. The Team effectively functioned; held a special convention, electing the 2022 RD (Victor Lau).

Today, a more vibrant Philippines is on its way to a stronger region; has a total of 12 clubs with additional clubs to be chartered in 2022.

Following the end of the war with Japan in 1945, internal warfare continued to disrupt the activities of YMCA and Y's Men's Club in China so that by 1949 all official activity of Y'sdom in Mainland China had ceased, even as the other clubs outside of China continue to operate. Thus, the Y's Men Chinese Region eventually became the Southeast Asia Region in 1961 at the Chicago International Convention. The Region is diverse with a spread of over 10 countries with a total of 34 active clubs and 620 members nowadays including Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Nepal, and Myanmar countries with different races, languages, religions, and cultures.

The Kowloon Club was chartered in 1952, operated a children's welfare club in a resettlement estate and provided scholarships for needy students for many years. The YMC of Victoria, chartered in 1962, supported the establishment of Y's Men's Centre for the Deaf.' The YMC of Peninsula, chartered in 1968 participated in the fundraising project 'Bike Marathon' organized by the Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong. The YMC of Bauhinia, chartered in 1979, was the first ladies club established by the Y's Menettes of Hong Kong Club. All the clubs sponsored and supported Chinese YMCA various notable projects including Chinese YMCA Youth Camp facilities in the island of Wong Yi Chau.



The Y's Men's Clubs in Thailand are the official members of the Y's Men International organization belonging to the SMIT District, Southeast Asia Region, and in the Asia Pacific Area led by voluntary Directors from a variety of careers who have been volunteering in serving communities far and near. There are four (4) clubs in three (3) cities, Bangkok, Chiangmai, Chiang Rai and Lanna Chiangmai with a total of 49 members.

#### Bangkok Club -

In September 1970, the Bangkok Club sponsored a new Y's Men's Club at Torrance, California. Y's Man Wichian Boonmapajorn, the Vice President attended the international convention in Fredericton of New Brunswick in July 1996. The Y's Men's Club of Bangkok was re-chartered on August 17, 1996 with 40 members.



In 1929, then General Secretary of Colombo YMCA, Mr. R.O. Buell introduced Y'sdom to Sri Lanka after attending the International Convention in Minneapolis, USA. The first Y's Men's Club - YMC of Colombo, was chartered in December 03, 1930, with its Charter President Sir Oliver Goonethilleke, former Governor General of Sri Lanka.

Y's Men's Club of Colombo introduced Y'sdom to India where it spread rapidly. As a result, the India-Sri Lanka Region came into being. The Y's Men's Club of Colombo has the distinction of being the oldest functioning Club in Asia. In 1973, Colombo was the first Club in Asia to admit women as fully fledged members.

Clubs were chartered continuously, and representations were made to International Headquarters for Sri Lanka to become a separate Region. In August, 1974, Colombo Club Flag was last displayed in India.



In 1975, at the International Convention in Atami, Japan, Sri Lanka became a Region of its own with Y's Man Kenneth Somanader as the first Regional Director.

In 2019, Club Beyond Borders YMC of Pakistan (Karachi) was chartered under the South/Western District of Sri Lanka.






Interim Meetings for Chartering Y's Men's Club of Taipei-Alpha





# Y's Menettes In Taiwan The Love and Support

In 2019, RD Tony Liao (2019-2020) proposed a plan to formalize and register all Y's Menettes' Clubs in Taiwan with the Y's Menettes' International. The plan was supported by PRD Frank Tsai, IPRD Kevin Su, directors and supervisors. Eleven (11) Y's Menettes' Clubs completed the registration with 138 members. Dues (CHF236) were remitted to IHQ in May 2022 with additional CHF1,949 contributions for the Y's Menettes' Global Project Funds.

In Taiwan, Y's Menettes activity is held annually by the District Governor. The "Y's Menette Lily Chen Welfare Fund" was established by Ym Charming Shen in January 2019 in memory of his menette. The fund's purpose is to promote the concept of good health, assist members in providing medical aid and promote education among others.

In April 2021, North District DG Shih-Chin Li held the "Menettes

Event in the North District" - a medical lecture on the theme of vision health at the Keelung City Council Multimedia Audiovisual Center.



On December 04, 2021, "Play with Love" was staged as a CS program by 66 members of DBC Triangle Y's Men and Y's Menette's Club for YMI Centennial Celebration. The program was organized jointly by Y's Men's Club and Y's Menettes' Club of Pingtung and sponsored by Y's Men's Club and Y's Menettes' Club of Taipei Downtown and Taichung Great Vision. 120 children with 50 parents from Intellectual Disability Association were invited as guests to play with Y's members. All members including RD of Taiwan Region, DG of South Taiwan, CP of three clubs and members donated NT\$135.000 (approximately US\$4500) in total to Pingtung Intellectual Disability Association.

#### BUILDING FELLOWSHIP **PROGRAMME**

Are you aware that as a Y's Man, you may qualify to be a BF delegate under the Building Fellowship Programme (formerly known as the Brotherhood Fund)? The BF Programme is designed to provide members with the opportunities to attend a convention and visit clubs as part of a cultural exchange and inspire them towards taking on leadership positions within the Movement.

This November 2022, Taiwan Region is expected to receive two Y's Men from the Russia Region who are supposed to be attending the Centennial Celebration as BF Delegates. With the sanctions in place on Russia because of its invasion of Ukraine, this is unlikely to materialize. Members like ASD Tetsuya Oda-san from Japan West Region reported having a memorable experience as a BF Delegate to Latin America from March 09 to 19, 2020 during which he had the privilege of attending the General Assembly of the YMCA of Bogota and visiting clubs in Colombia and Peru. This enriching experience has prompted him to explore areas of potential collaboration between the clubs in Latin America and Japan.

Presently, the BF Programme offers grants under four categories, namely:

- Travel Grants for club visitations and attendance at conventions.
- Youth and Leadership Development Grants this includes grants for internship under the iGo Program (Internship for Global Outreach).
- Area Leadership Discretionary Grants (ADL) these grants are given to assist the Areas in their development.
- Carbon Offset Grants 5% of the contributions received are set aside for projects that go towards protecting the environment.

These grants are made possible by the yearly financial contributions of the clubs. Annual awards are given to recognize Clubs and the Regions for their monetary contributions which include the proceeds from the sale of stamps. While many of the YMI Programmes are designed to assist stakeholders outside of YMI, the BF Programme is the only Programme whereby members' donations go towards building fellowship, making new friends overseas, and creating a lasting impact on their experience as a Y's Man. I hope many members will be able to enjoy the privilege of being a BF delegate.

Each year, the Japan East and West Regions jointly provide financial resources at the request of the Japan National YMCA, mainly in the area of youth training.

In 2020/21, JPY 2 000 000 (CHF 14,000) was given to support programmes, such as the All-Japan Youth Volunteer Leader's Training, YMCA Summer Seminars and YMCA cultural exchanges between Japanese and Korean students.



International ASF Contributions 2021-2022








